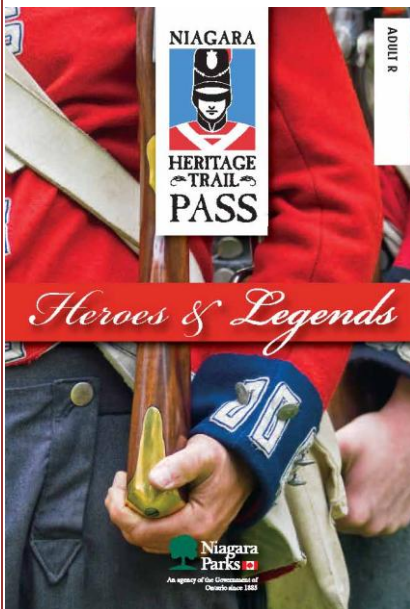


Celebrating 200 Years of Peace

The **Bicentennial of the War of 1812-1814** is fast approaching. To honour this important milestone, major changes were launched at Niagara Parks Heritage sites:

- **Old Fort Erie** features a new Welcome Centre with interactive and entertaining displays and a theatre. Located on the grounds of the bloodiest battlefield in Canada, history will come alive at this new interpretive centre, revealing the fascinating stories that made our country what it is today.
- In historic Queenston, **Laura Secord Homestead** is now home to a new interpretive centre and a "village" atmosphere that includes Queenston Chapel, a popular wedding venue that was moved from a short distance north on the Niagara Parkway. Laura's heroic walk to warn of impending battle is just one of the many "Women of War" stories you will learn about here.
- Just south of the charming town of Niagara-on-the-Lake, an expanded Tea Room has been added to **McFarland House**. Niagara Parks' oldest property, this Georgian home reveals gracious living 1800s style, complete with an authentic kitchen garden and home-baked goods.
