

# Trail Guide

Some important things you should know.

We hope you enjoy your visit to the Niagara Glen. We ask that you follow a few simple rules to help preserve this area for the enjoyment of the thousands of other visitors who come here each year.

Please respect the fragile natural environment of the Glen. Familiarize yourself with the trail system and stay on marked trails only. This protects rare plants and their habitat from being trampled and compacted.

Do not disturb rocks or fallen logs as they provide cover for small animals such as salamanders.

Take only photographs. Some plants

must grow for many years before they are able to flower and reproduce. Enjoy the beautiful display provided by the wildflowers, but leave them there for others to enjoy!

Niagara Parks regulations also require you to keep your dog on a leash at all times - please clean up after your pet as well. This is for the safety and security of both your pet and other visitors to the Glen.
