4. Land Acknowledgement

Chair Gale provided the following land acknowledgement:

The Niagara Parks Commission wishes to acknowledge and honour the lands along the Niagara River corridor as the traditional territory of Indigenous peoples. In both spirit and partnership, we recognize and thank the Six Nations of the Haudenosaunee, the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation of the Anishinaabek, the Neutral Nation, and all who provided stewardship of these lands over millennia. Recognition of the contributions of Indigenous peoples is consistent with our commitment to making the promise of Truth and Reconciliation real in our communities. We are grateful for the opportunity to live, work, and play here and thank all those who have served and continue to serve as caretakers of this special place.

5. Chair's Opening Remarks

Chair Gale requested that the recording secretary read aloud the names of Commissioners in attendance.

The Chair welcomed those in attendance and provided the following remarks:

"Good morning, everyone, and welcome to our March Public Commission Meeting. Spring is on the way, bringing longer days, fresh blooms and renewed energy across Niagara Parks. As we prepare for a busy season ahead, there's much to celebrate. Since our last meeting, we've reached several exciting milestones. On February 24, the Niagara Falls Illumination Board marked its 100th anniversary. For a century, this binational organization has illuminated the falls with a breathtaking multicolored display each night. It's become a cherished tradition enjoyed by millions. We celebrated with Steve Barnhart, Senior Director of Planning, Environment and Culture, who retired after nine years of dedicated service. A retirement tea was held at the Maintenance Centre to honour Steve's many contributions, and we thank him for his lasting impact on Niagara Parks. On March 7, we welcomed representatives from the Nikola Tesla Museum in Belgrade, Serbian Ambassador Dejan Ralević and other dignitaries to launch an exciting new exhibit at the Niagara Parks Power Station—Tesla: A Spark of Genius. This exhibit highlights Tesla's relentless pursuit of innovation, which revolutionized electricity generation, transmission and use—laying the foundation for much of today's technology. Featuring rare artifacts and personal items from the Nikola Tesla Museum in Belgrade, it also explores Tesla's deep connection to the Niagara Power Station and Niagara Falls. If you haven't visited yet, I highly encourage you to check it out. Tesla: A Spark of Genius will be on display through October 2025. On March 9, I was joined by Mayor Diodati and Commissioner La Caprara as we welcomed Consul General Angelica Escalona of the Philippines for the groundbreaking of a new memorial in the park, celebrating Dr. Jose Rizal, a symbol of Filipino advocacy, strength and courage. Mad Science activities have been included with admission to the Butterfly Conservatory on select days throughout February and March, providing kids with a fun and interactive way to



learn about butterflies, insects, and climate change. Mad Science activities are available daily during March Break and will wrap up this Sunday. Meanwhile, exciting progress continues on the new Children's Garden at the Botanical Gardens. Two key efforts are currently underway: securing donors and gathering community feedback through focus groups, which will help shape the final design later this year. This week, staff are actively engaging with children and families visiting the Butterfly Conservatory through colouring activities for kids and a survey for adults. We appreciate the team's efforts in leading these valuable discussions."
