These projects range from the Paradise Grove Oak Savannah Restoration to the Baker's Creek and Ussher's Creek Coastal Wetland Habitat Restorations, along with the Nature Exchange program at the Niagara Glen Nature Centre and the species audit of the Dufferin Islands ecosystem.
