

Ussher's Creek Bridge Replacement Project

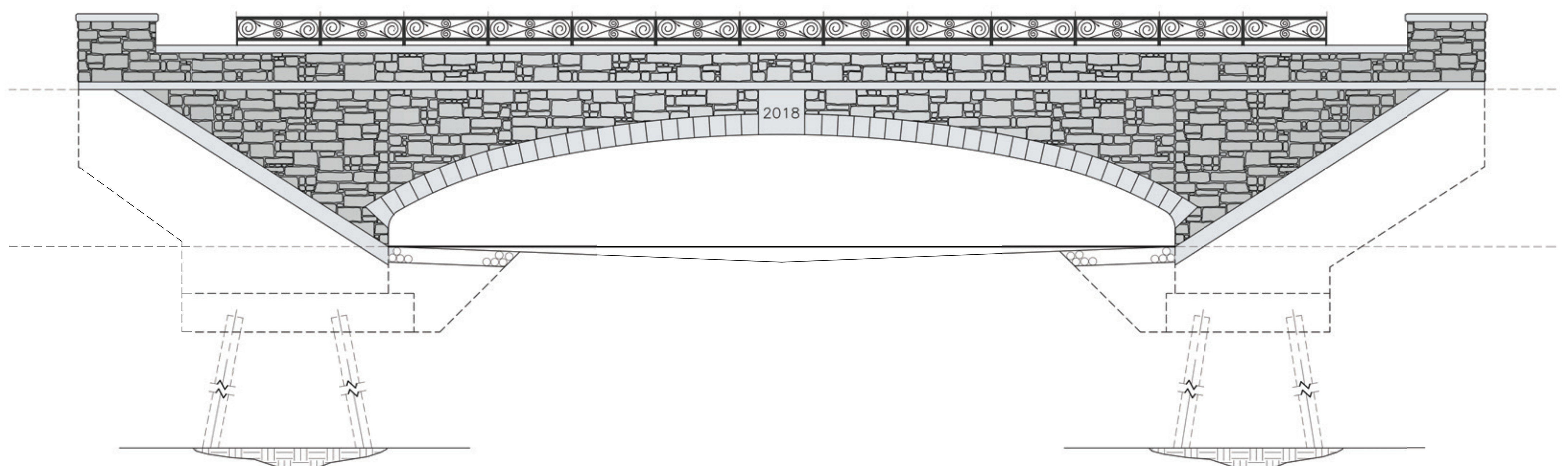
Originally constructed in 1911, Ussher's Creek bridge has undergone significant work over the past three decades. With replacement work on both sides of the bridge completed in 1989, an inspection in 2015 revealed the concrete arch bridge would last until 2020. With temporary repairs completed in March 2016, Niagara Parks has developed a strategy to replace Ussher's Creek bridge entirely by 2019.



Beginning in fall 2018, Rankin Construction will fully replace this classic Niagara Parks bridge, maintaining its heritage aesthetic and ensuring safe and convenient access from the south Niagara Parkway into the main core for all guests.

The new bridge will include railing designs to match the iconic Niagara Parks parapet wall and bike lanes for the many avid cyclists that make use of the Niagara Parks Recreation Trail. With a total replacement budget of \$1.4M, the project is expected to be complete by March 2019.
