



INDIGENOUS NIAGARA: LANDSCAPE OF NATIONS

Discover the living stories and deep-rooted Indigenous heritage that shaped the Niagara River corridor on this guided cultural experience. Learn how Indigenous communities have influenced the land, the people and the evolving story of Niagara.



This educational talk provides a chance to learn about the significance of key treaty agreements, the pivotal contributions of First Nation Allies during the War of 1812 and the ongoing connection between Niagara’s Indigenous communities and the land.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS:

Landscape of Nations: An educational talk led by a Niagara Parks subject expert through the commemorative memorial dedicated to the Haudenosaunee (Six Nations) Confederacy and the Indigenous allies who played pivotal roles in the War of 1812.

- **Laura Secord Homestead (+ 30 min)** Learn about this Canadian heroine and her Indigenous alliances during the War of 1812.
